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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

ART 247 is an introductory level course in studio photography. The course includes lectures, demonstrations, visual presentations, group critiques of student work, and supervised studio and lab work. Shooting assignments are designed to provide a survey of various studio photography disciplines, including portraiture, still life, fashion, and location studio work. Students will be encouraged to develop their own personal approach to each of these studio disciplines.

STUDENT LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Learning methods of controlling artificial light with strobes, umbrellas, soft boxes, barn doors and various studio backgrounds.
- 2. Learning how to use a digital SLR camera in a studio context.
- 3. Learning how to pose and frame live models, as well as working with inanimate objects.
- 4. Becoming familiar with a variety of disciplines within a studio environment, including portraiture, still life, fashion, and subjects in motion

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Attendance is required.

More than two unexcused absences will lower the Class Participation/Attendance component of your final grade.

More than 4 unexcused absences will lower your final Course grade by one full letter.

More than 6 unexcused absences and you will fail the course.

If you are sick and want the absence excused, I will need a doctor's note.

Consistent lateness or leaving class early will also adversely affect your grade.

- **2.** Class participation is considered an important part of the course and is strongly encouraged. Use of cell phones in class is strictly forbidden.
- **3. Shooting assignments** are generally due every two weeks.
 - failure to complete an assignment on time will result in a lowering of the grade for that assignment; specifically, one letter grade per week.
 - assignments not completed at the beginning of class on the due date will be considered late
 - any assignment handed in more than 3 weeks late will receive a 0.

- incomplete assignments, (i.e., insufficient prints or contact prints), cannot be accepted.
- assignments are graded based on technical execution, fulfillment of the specific assignment, and creativity of approach
- Note: if you are absent the day an assignment is given and want to see the demo visuals for that assignment, you can log on to school PC and open DriveL@Shared folder; then go to Course Info > Moore > ART 247 > Assg 1 (or any other assignmt)
- **4. Resubmit policy:** If you want to improve your grade on a given assignment:
- you may re shoot and/or re print that assignment, (in part or in full) and resubmit it at any time up to the last day of class.
 - late assignments cannot be resubmitted
 - vou can resubmit a maximum of 2 assignments
 - the highest grade possible on a resubmit is an A-
 - please hand in all the old prints, the contact prints, and new prints when resubmitting
 - label which prints are resubmits, with an 'R' on the back
- **5. Quiz and midterm exam:** There will be a quiz given early in the semester and an exam about halfway through. There will be no make up tests, except for serious personal illness.
- **6. Final project:** There will be a final project due at the end of the semester.
- **7. Reading assignments:** periodic reading assignments will be E mailed to you during the semester; you are required to do these readings in preparation for the next class lecture

- **3.** inkjet photo paper you will receive a 50 sheet box of Epson Ultra Premium photo paper luster surface cost: \$30.
 - you are free to go out and buy your own but it should be Epson inkjet premium photo paper because you may get a color cast if you use any other paper
 - this is your only expense beyond your lab fee
 - your lab fee pays for ink (which is very expensive)
- **4. matboard** you will be required to mat your final project
 - mat board will be supplied by the department
